Fees van Italiaanse fliks in Kaap

Die jongste rolprent van die bekende Italiaanse volprentmaker Lucretia Caviglioli onder die skuilnaam Italiaanse rolprente wat wys op die Italian Film Festival fees wat van 4 tot 6 Desember in die Luchthofstad in Kaapstad kompeteerd word.

Voorsig het hierdie jaar twee rolprente van Italiaanse genre wat ook op internasionale fees-arena's nader gevind het, is geëls.

Vooreerst die beurt op 4 Desember om 10:00 is 'n prent oor die voormalige modeontwerper Gianni Versace wat skopplins vir Irene soos prinses Diana, Madonna en Elton John ontwerp het. Die prent *Gianni Versace: The Emperor of Design* is volprentmaker, Massimo Coda, prent, sal toevolgendes wys by die voorstelling. Die prent begin in Apesano se kinderjare in Reggio Calabria, waar hy leer tekenwerk doen het by sy naaldrekerkerma, sy studies in die klassieke beskawings en sy opvallende uitbreiding van sy seksualliefde in die dorp. Later is hy geneoep om na Milaan te gaan - sy lewensverhaal word deur vriende en familieleden vertel; sy modelle, soos Carla Bruni, kry ook kans om meer oor hom te vertel. Die prent dek nie net sy opkoms in die mode-wêreld nie, maar ook sy treëns in die wêreld, op die musikante, die rolprentkenners en in die televisiewêreld.

Na die prent wys Anna van die regisseur Marco Amenta om 20:30. Die prent speel in die ongesoekte Sardinia af en handel oor Anna, 'n verligte jong vrou wat 'n plaas - wat haar pa son haer bemaak het - eie-handig bestuur. Tog staan tyd nie stil nie en bedrieg die opsig van 'n onspanningsoer naby haer plaas ook haer voortbestaan. Sy moet standpunt inneem en weg vir haer oortuig-

gines. Amenta beskryf sy prent as 'n opstand teen die verwoesting wat kapitalisme bring.

Op 5 Desember om 14:30 wys *The Order of Time* van Cavani.

Die speel af tydens die fees-tyding van 'n 50ste verjaardag waarvoor 'n klompie vriende in 'n villa langs die see byeen kom. Wanneer hulle vernem dat die wêreld moontlik binnekort gaan eindig, verander aksie.

Die prent is in samewerking met 'n Italiaanse geskryf en handel oor die beskouinge om die Italiaanse en eksistensiële tydverloop. Die prent het vanjaar op die Venesiese rolprentfees gewys waar Cavani vir haar lewenswerk verower is.

Om 16:00 wys *Kidnapped* van die regisseur Marco Bellocchio.

Die speel in 1898 in die Joodse buurt van Bologna af. Die soldate van die pous kom haal

'n Joodse gesin se sewejarige seun. Hy is met geboorde gedoop deur 'n verpligter en moet nou 'n verpligte Rooms-Katolieke opvoeding ondergaan, al is hy Joods. Die ouers sal eersal doen om hul kind terug te kry, en hul stryd neem gou 'n politieke wending aan - met verreikende gevolge.

Die regisseurs Massimiliano Bruno en Edoardo Leo se komedie *The Best Days* is daarna om 20:30 aan die beurt. Dit is 'n prent wat die ware aard van feesdae probeer ontmasker. Dit beeld vier verskillende stories uit, elk is gekoppel aan 'n feesdag. So is daar onder meer 'n parlementaal wat 'n Kerstdag aanbied in 'n poging om stemme te wen en so sy moses te kom; 'n welgestelde sakeman wat Oujaarsaand deurbring in 'n sopskambuis om sê sy beeld

in poësie en 'n paarjie wat Na-tertyd vir 'n paar dae in 'n kwartier woon.

Die aktrise Isabella Rossellini is te sien in *La Chimera*, wat op 6 Desember om 14:30 toe-teen word. Dit het natuurlik kompetisie op die Cannes-rolprentfees inspeeling en is in die eerste vertoning daarvan vir twee minute kort toegesig.

Die rolprent wat verduidelik het, was ook besonder suksesvol.

Die regisseur is Alice Rohrwacher en dit handel oor 'n Britse antropoloog, vertolk deur Josh O'Connor (die jonger prins Charles in *The Crown*), wat onwetende betrokke raak by 'n uitgebreide netwerk wat Etruskiese artefakte steel. Die kostelike artefakte word al vir dekades versamel en verhandel.

Om 18:00 wys die drama *The Boy* van die regisseur Giacomo Abbiatone. Dit is 'n de-luutprent en is met 'n Silver Bear-prys verower op vertoer op Berlynse rolprentfees. Dit volg die lewe van twee mans, Alessio, wat in Parys aankom om te leer by die Franse Vreemde Legioen om te sluit, en Jomo, 'n vryheidsvegter van die Nip-riese duita wat weg teen die-nantskoppige wat hul voorle-staan bedrieg. Op 'n dag kryen hul lewenspanne.

Die fees word afgesluit met die komedie *There's Still Tomorrow* om 20:30 van die regisseur Paola Cortellesi. Die min-drama speel af in Rome in die laai 1940's ná die oorlog en volg die lewe van Lella, 'n ma en huisvrou wat haar lot aanvaar - totdat daar op 'n dag 'n brief in haar posbus bekend.

Die prent toon hoe Lella (Cortellesi) met die hulp van 'n vriendin haar lewensomstandighede uitoorde. Die prent is 'n tong-in-die-kies-talk op die be-vryding van vroue.

Al die prente is vanjaar uit-geveel. Besprekings is plaaslik by Eventfrique.

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The 23rd edition of Italian Film Focus features eight highly acclaimed Italian films – all of which have been featured at major international film festivals. Entry is free, and tickets are available one hour before the event.

The showcase runs from 4 to 6 December 2023 at [Cinema Labia](#) on Orange in Cape Town. Italian Film Focus also features a delegation of seven filmmakers, who will present their films and conduct workshops in local film schools.

The **festival** opens with the docufiction *Gianni Versace: L'imperatore dei sogni* by Mimmo Calopresti, which will be presented by the director and producer Mariella Li Sacchi. It's an absolute premiere outside of Italy, depicting the creative and visionary ambition of a fashion genius through skilful editing of fiction, archival material, and unpublished interviews.

A film that narrates the solitary and daring struggle of a woman is *Anna* by Sicilian director Amenta, who has already offered us the clear figure of another heroine from the south with his previous film *The Sicilian Girl* (*La Siciliana Ribelle*).

As for female characters and personalities, Italian cinema seems to rediscover interest in and awareness of women's expressive strength, and audiences identify, even if the stories are about women who are not contemporary. This can be seen in the protagonist of *There's Still Tomorrow (C'è ancora domani)* by Paola Cortellesi, which will be presented by the two screenwriters –

Giulia Calenda and Furio Andreotti.

A story that blends tension and smiles, with the 'heroine' appearing resigned, accepting abuse because everyone else does, because, by her nature, she is peaceful and always finds a justification for the violence she is subjected to. However, in the end, she finds redemption by gaining awareness as a citizen. In the dual role of character and director, Cortellesi gives us a drama that is intimately familiar, but inevitably historical and social.

Giacomo Abbruzzese's Disco Boy

With respect to characters pushed to the limit out of necessity but also by choice, the debut film *Disco Boy* by Giacomo Abbruzzese stands out. His background as a documentary filmmaker shows in the precision with which the frames are composed and the faces and landscapes are captured. It eventually transcends into a semi-dreamlike vision, which is no less effective in its political and historical significance. The director will be present at the screening.

The renowned director Marco Bellocchio presents his film *Kidnapped*, which tells a non-contemporary story hooked around a family nucleus. But here, diversity and injustice are not about a gender issue, but about what is defined as 'race' and religion. The Jew is seen as the other, as someone who must be 'normalized' and brought to the 'right' side. A depiction of an historical period and a truth seldom told and represented in Italian books and films.

The organisers also present the latest work of the tireless and always insightful Liliana Cavani, who tells us about a near future deeply rooted in the present. In a classic piece with high-level actors, she explores the unpredictable dynamics of a group of so-called friends when an external disruptive event occurs.

The film selection also includes *Chimera*, the fourth film by another accomplished director – Alice Rohrwacher, presented and awarded at the latest Cannes Film Festival. With her unmistakable narrative style, which skilfully blends everyday life, myth, and rural landscape with depth and amusement, she takes us into a story of marginalized characters who 'plunder' history out of necessity and with a touch of madness.

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Then a work where smiles abound and where everything begins with the best intentions begins with the celebration of a holiday, but things inevitably takes a turn. The film reveals our inability to manage human and professional relationships with maturity and sincerity, especially towards ourselves. This is what happens in *Best Days (I Migliori Giorni)* by Massimiliano Bruno and Edoardo Leo.

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The festival is organized in collaboration with the Italian Ministry of Culture, the Italian Embassy in Pretoria, the Italian Cultural Institute, and the Italian Consulate in Cape Town.
